



LETTER FROM DDI PRESIDENT & CEO JENNIFER SCRIPPS





Downtown Dallas is the envy of the nation. The year 2022 demonstrated why.

We opened our newest and biggest park, the redeveloped Carpenter Park, in May. It is the third of four major planned parks to come online as part of a public-private partnership between nonprofit Parks for Downtown Dallas and the City of Dallas, with DDI responsible for programming and managing the each of these premier spaces. In less than 20 years, 23 acres of underutilized land, parking lots and streets have been transformed into new Downtown park land. No other downtown in America has enjoyed such a parks renaissance.

Investments in new greenspaces is part of what is fueling other projects and corporate relocations. Hoque Global's \$400 million mixed-use One Newpark development promises to reinvigorate the south side of Downtown. The world's leading dermatology company and maker of Cetaphil, Galderma, relocated its U.S. headquarters from Fort Worth to Downtown's Trammell Crow Center. Planning advanced on the \$1 billion Field Street District on the north side of Downtown and on a \$500 million, 980,000-square-foot campus for 5,000 Goldman Sachs employees just north of Woodall Rodgers Freeway.

DDI was also proud to help lead the community coalition that pushed for the passage of a November ballot initiative to fund a portion of the \$3 billion Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center Dallas redevelopment project. The vision, which DDI helped craft, is to transform the southwest portion of Downtown into a walkable, bike-friendly entertainment district that connects to the Cedars heading south and will turn this guadrant of Downtown into a place that locals will want to enjoy.

It is no wonder that thousands of new residents are moving to Downtown every year. In the late 1990s, just a few hundred people lived in one residential property. Today, our population is nearing 15,000 across 40 multifamily properties and a variety of townhomes and condominiums, with demand continuing to surge. We are positioning ourselves for more growth.

Matthews Southwest's The Galbraith, on the east side of Downtown, opened with 217 apartments, more than half of which are reserved for residents earning significantly below the average area median income. Spectrum Properties is moving forward with a \$33 million Farmers Market residential development that includes 30 percent affordable housing. Plans to convert nearly 2 million square feet of existing Downtown office space into luxury apartments "will remake Downtown for the better," The Dallas Morning News editorial board wrote.

Every major city faces challenges and Dallas is no exception. As part of the Dallas R.E.A.L. Time Rapid Rehousing initiative, DDI locked arms with our government and nonprofit partners to help rehouse people experiencing homelessness on the streets of Downtown, some for decades. For this and other work that you will read about in the forthcoming pages, we could not be prouder of our 75 dedicated Security, Clean Team, Homeless Outreach, and Ambassador team members. They are on the front lines daily keeping Downtown clean, safe, and welcoming for all.

This year marks DDI's 65th year in operation. The "Blue Sapphire" anniversary is said to symbolize loyalty and peace. I find that fitting, as it is your loyalty to our urban core that is helping fuel this historic success. It is your longstanding loyalty to this nonprofit organization that allows our team, our Downtown, and our city partnerships to flourish.



GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

DDI is the voice of and leading advocate for the urban heart of one of the fastest growing cities in the country. We are immersed in local, state, and national policymaking to ensure continued growth and prosperity for all people of Downtown Dallas.





- DDI invested \$100,000 into the successful Proposition A ballot initiative.
 - Dallas voters on Nov. 8 overwhelmingly approved the \$1.5 billion measure to revitalize the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center and surrounding areas. It also will fund much-needed upgrades for six iconic venues at Fair Park.
- DDI Board of Directors approved legislative priorities for the 88th Texas Legislative Session, with a focus on Economic Development, Public Safety & Quality of Life, Mobility & Infrastructure, Housing & Development, and Education & Workforce Development.
- Successfully advocated for the formation of nonprofit City Economic Development Corporation to support major projects and lead marketing, branding and business retention and expansion in Dallas.
- Support for \$33 million Farmers Market plan
 that includes 100 apartments, a new North
 Texas Food Bank corporate office, and
 pedestrian plaza improvements. It is the last
 planned redevelopment of a parcel in that
 district and includes a mix of affordable and
 market rate units.






